

Proper Use of Enserv **Biohazard** Tubs

- 1) Each Enserv bin must have a red, biohazard bag lining it before being filled. A properly completed Hazardous Material Label (HML) must be affixed to the bag.



- 2) The Tub **must Not** be over-filled and **must Not weigh more than 40 lbs full!**
- 3) The red-bag lining must be tied securely after the Tub has been filled.

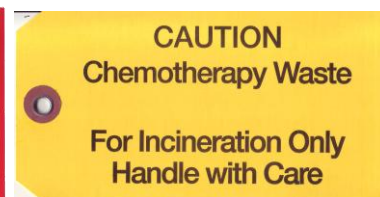
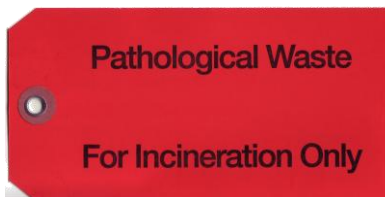


- 4) The Tub must have the lid placed securely on it. The proper way to secure the lid is to **line up the lid's handles with the handles of the Tub itself.**



- 5) Finally, all red Tubs containing Pathological or Chemotherapy waste **MUST** have the applicable tag placed on them. These tags are supplied by your Enserv Driver and/or EHS. Affix the hanging tag on the handle with the supplied wire.
